

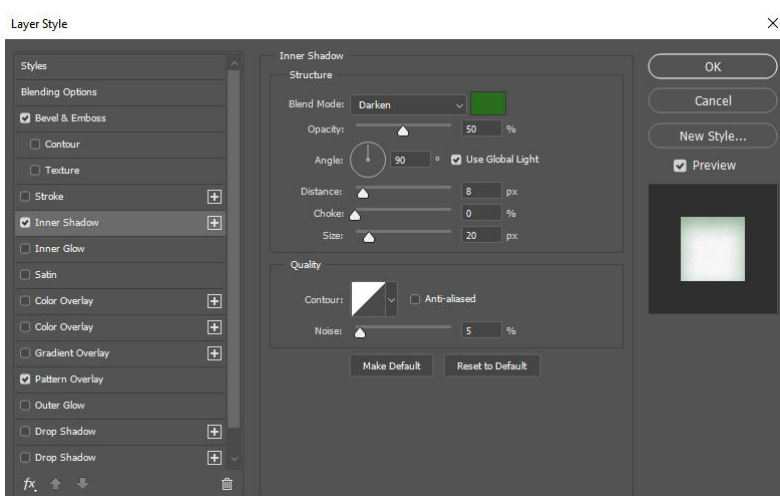
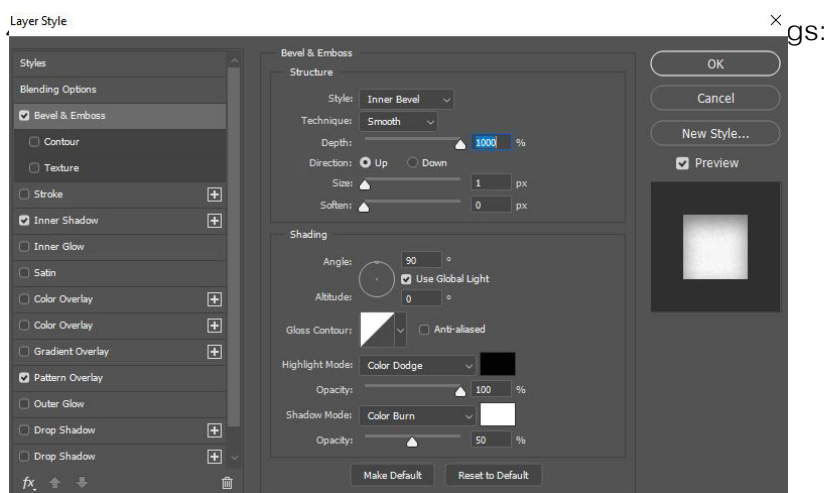
Paper Cut-Out Effect



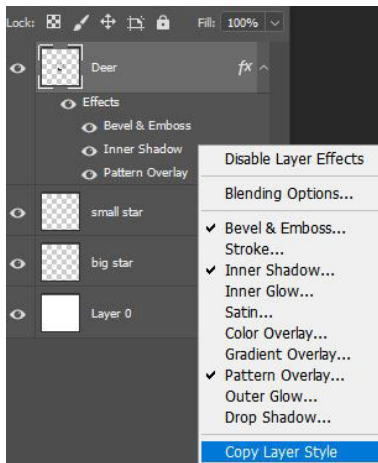
1. Create a series of filled shapes (filled with a colour). For this effect to work they must be of different sizes. I created a few stars with a deer in the middle. You can make the shapes in Illustrator or Photoshop but once the shapes have been created you will be working in Photoshop only.

2. Create a new layer for every shape in Photoshop, ie, every shape sits on its own layer. If you brought the shapes in from Illustrator, rasterize them: right-click on the layer style and select Rasterize Layer from the menu.

3. Right click on the first layer and apply a Pattern Overlay; I used a light coloured paper for mine.

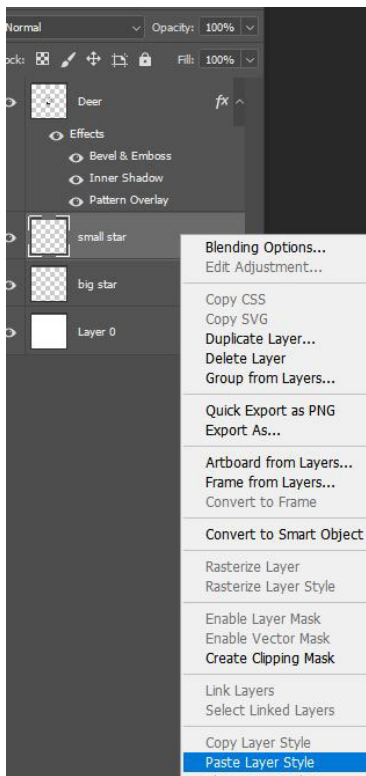


The shade of green I used was: #266d18.



and select Copy Layer Style from the menu.

7. Right click on the remaining layers and Paste Layer Style:



And that's all there is to it, really.
